

Dear Entiat Families and Community Members,

The last few months, I have written about the significant increase in enrollment from last year which has caused us some growing pains. Thankfully, our enrollment has leveled off somewhat. However, I really feel that Entiat has been discovered as the gem that it is and believe we will continue to see more growth. As the Superintendent, it is vital that I stay on top of that growth and be able to anticipate the impact of that growth on our school. On Halloween, I went on a ride along with City Planner Mark Botello. I asked him to show me all the areas where we can expect to see houses or businesses pop up. It was enlightening, but also caused a little bit of uneasiness. While I am not against growth, if it comes too



rapidly, there can be some adverse effects on schools and infrastructure. I have no doubt, we will see more families come to live in our great community and we need to plan for it.

When families are looking to move to a small community, one of the main things they consider is the school. The first thing I did when I became Superintendent was to reach out to our mayor, Chamber of Commerce and city planner to make sure we developed a tight partnership. I believe we are one team and better together (see motto below). I also believe the school serves as the heart of a small community by providing education, serving as a gathering place, hosting events, offering services, contributing to the local economy, and fostering a sense of unity and identity among residents. Welcome to November! We are thankful for our hardworking students, committed staff, and dedicated parents and community members. As you will find throughout this newsletter, our Entiat students are growing academically and invested in many extracurricular activities. We are blessed to have the incredible support of you all to ensure these opportunities are provided to our students. We wanted to take a moment to share some important information regarding the Smarter Balanced Assessment scores for Entiat students from the 2022-2023 school year. The Smarter Balanced Assessment is taken in the Spring and serves as a temperature gauge for assessing our students' proficiency in English Language Arts and Mathematics. It also helps us identify areas of success and where improvement is needed. While the overall results show students made good progress in some areas, our staff remains committed to evaluating assessment results and improving where needed. Our teaching teams and school improvement committee will continue to evaluate the SBA results along with Fall iReady, NWEA data, and classroom data to develop plans for improving program support and classroom instruction in both English Language Arts and Math. We also want to emphasize that while these test scores provide valuable information about our students' academic performance,

they are just one piece of the puzzle. It is importance to provide a well-rounded education that includes not only standardized testing but also the development of social and emotional skills, critical thinking, and creativity.

Additionally, we understand that each student is unique, and their progress may vary. Over the last two weeks, families should have received the most recent Smarter Balanced Student Report if their student tested at Entiat and were in grades 3-10 last Spring. REMIND is the official messaging platform for Entiat School District. It is a messaging system that allows us to send quick messages via text, push notifications, or email and phone calls to members of the Entiat school community, without revealing personal contact information. As our district wide messaging system, REMIND will be used to send: direct teacher communication, transportation information, extra-curriculars, athletics, and inclement weather notifications. This important messaging tool also translate messages between teacher, student, and families. PLEASE contact your student's teacher if you have not signed up for REMIND yet.

Entiat School District's Remind Communication Policy

Purpose of Remind @ District/Overview of functionality

Remind is now the official messaging platform for Entiat School District. Remind is a messaging system that allows us to send quick messages via text, push notifications, or email and phone calls to members of the Entiat community, without revealing personal contact information. As our School and district wide messaging system, Remind will be used to send: direct teacher communication, and for transportation, extra-curriculars, and athletics.

Administrator Expectations

District and school administrators will use Remind to communicate scheduling updates, inclement weather and transportation changes. Administrators are not expected to reply to Remind messages from their parent community. School administrators/District Administrators are expected to support the training of their own teachers on Remind. School administrators will be able to request message history of a member of their school community from district administrators. School Administrators are expected to set office hours in Remind to reflect their workday. Target messaging frequency: at least one school wide announcement every two weeks or as a need arises.

Teacher Expectations

Teachers will use Remind to communicate with parents and/or students. This includes class announcements and 2way messaging. Administrators are expected to support the training of their own teachers on Remind. Use cases: assignment distribution, positive behavior support, personalized learning, etc. Teachers are expected to set office hours in Remind to reflect their workday. Target messaging frequency: no more than one class announcement per week. Remind messages will be used as an artifact for your teacher review cycle to measure family/community engagement.

Parent Expectations

Parents can expect to receive messages from the district, school, teachers, and other school staff on Remind. Parents are asked to opt in to receiving Remind messages. Parents can choose if they would like to receive Remind messages via SMS, in app messages, or by email. Parents should contact Heather Long or Marilyn Kamphaus in the school office at (509) 784-1800 #2, with any questions about Remind.

Student Expectations

Students can expect to receive messages from the district, school, teachers, and other school staff on Remind. Students can expect to contact teachers directly on Remind. Students are asked to opt in to receiving Remind messages. Students can choose if they would like to receive Remind messages via SMS, in app messages, or by email. Students should contact their classroom teacher with any questions about Remind. Student run organizations may also use Remind to organize communication.


