EMERGENCY CLOSURE, LATE-START OR EARLY DISMISSAL

The following procedures will be employed by the district when, in the opinion of the administration, conditions exist that warrant school closure, delay or early dismissal.

School Closure will occur when conditions are so severe that it is not in the best interest of any students to be in school attendance.

Delayed Opening situations may occur which will delay school opening two hours (start time of 10:15). If your students' bus does not arrive within fifteen minutes of its regular time, please look for a notification listed below for information concerning the delayed opening. Morning preschool will be canceled and no breakfast will be served.

Students who arrive at school because they did not hear the closure or delay information are asked to go to the main office.

Early Dismissal situations may occur in which school would be released at an earlier time. Before releasing students, we would attempt to contact parents, and provide notifications as listed below. Normal bus take home routes would be in effect. If the driver determines there to be no adult supervision, the student will be returned to school and kept safe under adult supervision, until the guardian arrives.

Communication/ Notifications A message will be sent out via the Remind App and Skyward. Information regarding closure will be available on local media outlets (560AM KPQ, 102.1FM KPQ, 93.5FM KOZI, NCWLife). Determination of delays/closures will be made by 5:45 am. Information will be posted at [www.entiatschools.org]www.entiatschools.org and on the Entiat Schools Facebook page.

CIERRE DE EMERGENCIA, INICIO TARDE O SALIDA ANTICIPADA

Los siguientes procedimientos serán empleados por el distrito cuando, en opinión de la administración, existan condiciones que justifiquen el cierre de la escuela, el inicio tarde o la salida anticipada.

Cierre de la Escuela ocurrirá cuando las condiciones sean tan graves que no sea conveniente que ningún estudiante asista a la escuela.

Inicio Tarde puede darse en situaciones que retrasen el inicio de clases en dos horas (hora de inicio a las 10:15). Si el autobús de su estudiante no llega dentro de los quince minutos de su hora regular, consulte la notificación a continuación para obtener información sobre el retraso. El preescolar matutino será cancelado y no se servirá desayuno.

Los estudiantes que lleguen a la escuela porque no escucharon la información sobre el cierre o retraso deben dirigirse a la oficina principal.

Salida Anticipada puede darse en situaciones en las que la escuela tenga que liberar a los estudiantes en un horario anterior. Antes de liberar a los estudiantes, intentaremos contactar a los padres y proporcionar notificaciones según se indica a continuación. Las rutas normales de autobuses para llevar a los estudiantes a casa estarán en efecto. Si el conductor determina que no hay supervisión adulta, el estudiante será devuelto a la escuela y permanecerá bajo supervisión adulta hasta que llegue el tutor.

Comunicación/Notificaciones: Se enviará un mensaje a través de la aplicación Remind y Skyward. La información sobre el cierre estará disponible en los medios locales (560AM KPQ, 102.1FM KPQ, 93.5FM KOZI, NCWLife). La determinación de retrasos/cierres se hará a las 5:45 am. 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I'll start with an apology as I realized I missed adding a message to the October newsletter. I'll try not to let that happen again. I wanted to share a couple of things that have happened in our district. I'll start with the positive:

Gear Up Grant – we were awarded a 7-year grant worth more than \$100,000 per year to implement a Gear Up program and hire a Gear Up advisor. Gaining Early Awareness and Readiness for Undergraduate Programs (GEAR UP) is a competitive federal program that provides six- and seven-year grants to education/community partnerships and states to increase the number of low-income students prepared to enter and succeed in postsecondary education. GEAR UP's three objectives are:

- Increase academic performance and preparation for postsecondary education.
- Increase high school graduation and postsecondary participation rates.
- Increase students' and their families' knowledge of post-secondary options, preparation, and finances.
- Lead in Drinking Water now for the not so positive In accordance with Washington State law (<u>RCW 28A.210.410</u>), the Washington State Department of Health (DOH) collected samples from water fixtures throughout our schools on September 13, 2024. These samples were tested for potential lead contamination in our drinking water. What we found:
 - The test results were received by the district on October 16, 2024. We had ten (10) fixtures test >15 ppb and two (2) fixtures test with lead levels between 5 & 15 ppb.
 - No established drinking fountains/bottle fillers in the district tested as having high levels of lead.
 - No positive tests for lead came from the Elementary wing including the kitchen, cafeteria, concessions or gymnasiums.
 - All positive tests came from the MS/HS wing and involved the room sinks which are rarely used for drinking.
 - While this isn't great news, we feel there has been very minimal exposure to lead for our students and staff. Nevertheless, we are committed to ensuring that
 all drinking water in our schools is safe. We have taken immediate action as needed and are working with the Washington State Dept. of Health and the
 Chelan-Douglas Health District to mitigate the problem.
 - We will continue to prioritize the health and safety of our students and staff and will keep you updated as we move forward. Please see much more information on our main page at <u>www.entiatschools.org</u>.

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Voy a comenzar con una disculpa, ya que me di cuenta de que no incluí un mensaje en el boletín de octubre. Intentaré que no vuelva a suceder. Quería compartir algunas cosas que han sucedido en nuestro distrito. Comenzaré con las positivas:

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Subvención GEAR UP – nos otorgaron una subvención de 7 años con un valor de más de \$100,000 por año para implementar un programa GEAR UP y contratar a un
asesor GEAR UP. La subvención "Gaining Early Awareness and Readiness for Undergraduate Programs" (GEAR UP) es un programa federal competitivo que otorga
subvenciones de seis y siete años a asociaciones educativas/comunitarias y estados para aumentar el número de estudiantes de bajos ingresos preparados para
ingresar y tener éxito en la educación postsecundaria. Encuentra más información en https://gearup.wa.gov/.

Los tres objetivos de GEAR UP son:

Aumentar el rendimiento académico y la preparación para la educación postsecundaria.

Incrementar las tasas de graduación de la escuela secundaria y de participación en la educación postsecundaria.

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Ampliar el conocimiento de los estudiantes y sus familias sobre opciones postsecundarias, preparación y financiamiento.

- Plomo en el Agua Potable ahora, una noticia no tan positiva De acuerdo con la ley del Estado de Washington (RCW 28A.210.410), el Departamento de Salud del Estado de Washington (DOH) recolectó muestras de los grifos de agua en nuestras escuelas el 13 de septiembre de 2024. Estas muestras se analizaron para detectar posible contaminación por plomo en nuestra agua potable. Esto es lo que encontramos:
 - Los resultados de las pruebas se recibieron en el distrito el 16 de octubre de 2024. Diez (10) grifos mostraron niveles >15 ppb y dos (2) grifos mostraron niveles de plomo entre 5 y 15 ppb.
 - Ninguna de las fuentes de agua establecidas ni los dispensadores de botellas en el distrito arrojaron altos niveles de plomo.

No hubo pruebas positivas de plomo en el ala de Primaria, incluyendo la cocina, cafetería, concesionarios o gimnasios.

- Todas las pruebas positivas provienen del ala de Secundaria/Preparatoria y están relacionadas con los lavamanos de las aulas, que rara vez se usan para beber. Aunque esta no es una buena noticia, creemos que la exposición al plomo ha sido muy mínima para nuestros estudiantes y personal. No obstante, estamos
 - comprometidos a asegurar que toda el agua potable en nuestras escuelas sea segura. Hemos tomado acciones inmediatas según sea necesario y estamos trabajando con el Departamento de Salud del Estado de Washington y el Distrito de Salud de Chelan-Douglas para mitigar el problema.
- Continuaremos priorizando la salud y seguridad de nuestros estudiantes y personal y les mantendremos informados a medida que avancemos. Por favor, vean más información en nuestra página principal en <u>www.entiatschools.org</u>.

CLASS OF 2025

- 1. Seniors should have created a LOGIN for their FAFSA account so that they are prepared to complete their Financial Aid information beginning December 1st.
- 2. Scholarships are being shared weekly, all students interested in post-secondary education should be applying. (4-year college/2-year college/Tech. Schools, etc.)
- 3. COMMONAPP A one stop college application that allows a student to complete one application and send it to over 300 colleges.
- 44 Students completed the ASVAB test at school on October 2nd, and a representative came to the school on October 23rd to go over the test results
 with all of those that took the test. This information helps the students see their areas of strength and potential career choices that they might be
 interested in.
- On October 28th a representative from the Youth Challenge Academy in Bremerton, Washington visited our school to share the experience of attending their on-site 6-month program to help students learn job skills, discipline and potentially earn 8-10 credits in a six month period. The next session is in January and the application process has begun.
- On November 7th all of our 11th and 12th graders will be attending the North Central Washington College and Career Expo down at Wenatchee Valley College. In addition to connecting with colleges and industry professionals, students who attend the expo will get to engage in hands-on work based activities, explore workplace tools and equipment, and learn from real job descriptions. The event runs from 8:00 a.m. 12: p.m.
- COURSEWARE: Our newly updated Credit Retrieval program is up and running for students that either need to makeup credits, or students that are Highly Capable and want to extend their learning opportunities. Multiple classes are available for our students to take online.
- COMMUNITY SERVICE: As part of the Entiat High School graduation requirements students need to complete 40 hours of Community Service during their four years in High School. A great opportunity to help out and earn hours is November 15th and 16th during the set-up/running of/cleanup at the Holiday Bazaar here at the Entiat Gym. Students can sign up with their advisors or with Mr. Edwardson.



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RELEASE OF STUDENT DIRECTORY INFORMATION

Our existing policy allows us to release this directory information, which may include:

- · Student name, address, telephone number
- Date and place of birth
- Weight and height of members of athletic teams
- Major field of study and degrees and awards received
- Dates of attendance

Parents have the right to request that any or all of this information not be released. If you wish to make this request, please submit it in writing to the high school office.

TEACHER QUALIFICATIONS

You, as a parent, have the right to request the following information on the professional qualifications of your child's teachers.

- Licensing and certification for grade level and subject.
- Emergency or other provisional status.
- BA major and graduate degrees
- Paraprofessional qualifications (if serving the child).
